

Klaus Meerholz awarded SPIE Senior Member

Professor Klaus Meerholz amongst the 136 newly elected SPIE Senior Members with his scientific contributions to the optics & photonics community.

Köln/San Diego, August 23, 2018 – At this year's SPIE conference on Optics + Photonics in San Diego, the SPIE Membership Committee honored Professor Klaus Meerholz as new Senior Member.

SPIE is a large professional society, which organizes about 140 meetings, conferences, exhibitions, and education programs every year for researchers in optical engineering and applications, nanotechnology, quantum science, and organic photonics. The SPIE Optics + Photonics conference is one of the largest expert meetings on multidisciplinary optical sciences worldwide.
